However, due to differences in:

- Medical and nursing education systems
- Clinical training standards
- Healthcare laws and professional regulations
- Regulatory requirements

foreign-trained doctors and nurses cannot practice immediately upon arrival in Canada.

Instead, they must complete a bridging program that align their education and competencies with Canadian standards.

WHAT IS A BRIDGING PROGRAM IN CANADA

Key Clarification

Bridging programs:

- Does not automatically grant licenses

Instead, it acts as a critical transition step between foreign nursing education and Canadian professional practice.

WHO SHOULD CONSIDER THESE PROGRAMS

Nurses

- Registered nurses trained outside Canada

- Nurses required to complete additional education before licensure

Doctors

- Medical doctors trained outside Canada
- Physicians seeking entry into Canadian residency
- Doctors required to complete practice readiness or assessment programs

PATHWAYS AND PREPARATORY PROGRAMS FOR DOCTORS

Unlike nursing, doctors do not have a single “bridging certificate.” Instead, Canada uses assessment and residency-based pathways.

PRACTICE READY ASSESSMENT (PRA) PROGRAMS

Who It Is For:

Internationally trained doctors with recent clinical experience.

Purpose:

To assess whether a doctor can practice safely under Canadian standards.

Key Provinces Offering PRA Programs:

- Alberta
- Saskatchewan
- Manitoba
- British Columbia

Typical Duration:

3–12 months (assessment + supervised practice)

Important Note:

PRA programs are highly competitive and province-specific.

MEDICAL RESIDENCY PATHWAYS (IMG STREAM)

Most internationally trained doctors must:

1. Pass medical exams
2. Secure a residency position
3. Complete supervised postgraduate training

Key Institutions Involved:

- Canadian medical schools
- Provincial health authorities

MEDICAL PREPARATORY & ACCESS PROGRAMS

Some Canadian institutions offer:

- Canadian healthcare orientation programs
- Communication and professionalism training
- Exam preparation support

- Valid passport
- Canadian study permit (for academic programs)

IMPORTANT LICENSING REALITY

Neither doctors nor nurses are licensed automatically after training.

Licensure depends on:

- Provincial regulatory bodies
- Examination outcomes
- Clinical assessments
- Residency or supervised practice

Any program should be approached as a strategic step, not a guarantee.
